School & Community Insights

Located in Tolland County approximately 15 miles east of Hartford, Bolton has a population of approximately 5,000. A socio-economically diverse suburban community with a rural character, Bolton is in close proximity to the University of Connecticut and Manchester Community College. Bolton has two schools with a total district population of 734 students, Bolton Center School (serving Grades K-8) and Bolton High School (serving Grades 9-12), with additional students attending from Columbia and Hartford, Connecticut.

Bolton High School, a four-year comprehensive public high school with a current enrollment of 216 students in grades 9-12, is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. Students are encouraged to pursue courses with academic rigor and intellectual challenge. There are 51 students in the Class of 2024, and the faculty consists of 30 instructors with an average class size of 11. Students are also given the opportunity to take AP and Early College Experience courses from local colleges and universities. Bolton High School prides itself on a personalized educational experience with individualized learning.

91.5% of the Class of 2023 went on to pursue post-secondary education after graduation in the form of two- and four-year colleges/universities or technical programs. The remaining graduates entered the workforce or joined the military.

Bolton High School Curriculum

Bolton High School offers an extensive array of curricular and co-curricular courses and programs to challenge its diverse student population. Students can choose from academic and fine arts classes as well as vocational and technical experiences. Courses are divided into four levels of study and are designed to meet the individual student's needs. In addition to Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment courses through the University of Connecticut, Eastern Connecticut State University, and Manchester Community College, opportunities exist for students to take accelerated courses at area magnet schools, including the Greater Hartford Academy for Math/Science and the Arts.


